Class 2 – Open Youngstock *In hand, open to any breed or type, 1, 2 or 3 year old.*

Class 3 – TB/Ex Racer *In Hand open to any age*

Class 4 – Open 13.2 and under *In Hand, any breed or type.*

Class 5 – Open 13.3 and over *In Hand, any breed or type.*

Class 6 – Best Condition *In hand, any breed or type*

Championship *1st and 2nd place from class 1 to 6 to go forward to the championship. Champion and reserve to go forward to the supreme championship.*

Class 9 – Equifest Open Mountain & Moorland In Hand *Open to In Hand Mountain & Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Connemara, Dales, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A, B, C and D. Stallion, mare, colt, filly or gelding, any age. Classes may be divided according to entries.*

Class 12 – Equifest Open Mountain & Moorland Ridden *Open to Mountain & Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Connemara, Dales, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A, B, C and D. Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Rider any age. Classes may be divided according to entries.*

Championship *1st and 2nd place from class 7 to 12 to go forward to the championship. Champion and reserve to go forward to the supreme championship.*

TGCA Qualifying Class Section – TOYS Best of Breed Finals

Class 13 – TGCA Youngstock. Open to fillies, colts and geldings aged 1, 2 and 3 years old.

Class 14 – TGCA In Hand Senior. Open to mares, stallions and geldings aged 4 years and over. This class can be done as an open height class or split as per below: Small - Not to exceed 148cm Large - 148cm and above

Class 15 – TGCA Ridden. Open to mares, stallions and geldings aged 4 years and over. This class can be done as an open height class or split as per below: Small - Not to exceed 148cm Large - 148cm and above

Quest for a Star Championship - Traditional Gypsy Cobs 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship as per below rule. ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship. Membership card and Members qualification card (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. Youngstock and Seniors may be split for Quest for a Star Championship purposes with a separate Quest Championship for each section. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS. *Champion and reserve to go forward to the supreme championship.*

The Greatest Gelding Award - Traditional Gypsy Cobs The award is aimed to encourage the showing of geldings, therefore creating a market for often unwanted colt foals and enabling the creation of a network of potential performance prospects to represent the best Traditional Gypsy Cob breed in the World at the highest level. This Award should be given to the highest placed registered Traditional Gelding. The judge will award this within the classes/championship

TGCA Qualifying Class sections – TOYS Part Bred finals.

Class 16 – TGCA Youngstock. Open to fillies, colts and geldings aged 1, 2 and 3 Years old

Class 17 – TGCA In Hand Senior. Open to mares, stallions and geldings aged 4 years and over. This class can be done as an open height/type class or split as per below: Small - Not to exceed 148cm/Large - 148cm and above Or Native/Non-Native (Plaited/Hogged)

Class 18 – TGCA Ridden. Open to mares, stallions and geldings aged 4 years and over. This class can be done as an open height/type class or split as per below: Small - Not to exceed 148cm/Large - 148cm and above Or Native/Non-Native (Plaited/Hogged)

Go for Glory (GOG) Championship – Part Bred Traditional Gypsy Cobs 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA part bred classes may go forward to the Go for Glory Championship. For 2024 TOYS qualifiers, the handler/rider and exhibits (apart from stallions) do not have to be TGCA members/registered on the date of the show. Youngstock and Seniors may be split for Go for Glory Championship purposes with a separate Championship for each section. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Crowning Glory Championships at TOYS. *Champion and reserve to go forward to the supreme championship.*

The Greatest Gelding Award - Part Bred Gypsy Cobs The award is aimed to encourage the showing of geldings, therefore creating a market for often unwanted colt foals and enabling the creation of a network of potential performance prospects to represent the best Part Bred Traditional Gypsy Cob breed in the World at the highest level. This Award should be given to the highest placed registered Part Bred Traditional Gelding. The judge will award this within the classes/championship

Class 19 – Open under 13.2 Ridden Open to any type and any age. Horse or pony to be 13.2 and under.

Class 20 – Open over 13.3 Ridden Open to any type and any age. Horse or Pony be 13.3 and over.

Class 21- Equifest Ridden Cobs *Open Ridden Cob, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms. To be shown hogged and trimmed. Riders any age*

Class 22- Equifest Ridden Hunters *Open Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 158cms. Riders any age.*

Class 23 – Equifest Ridden part breeds *Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exhibits in this section must be registered in the Part Bred section of their respective Breed Society. Horses and ponies will not be ridden at the final. Suitable sized riders of any age.*

Class 24- Ridden Local Rider. Open to any rider who lives within 20 miles of the showground.

Championship *1st and 2nd place from class 19 to 24 to go forward to the championship. Champion and reserve to go forward to the supreme championship*

Class 25 – Concours In Hand. *This is not fancy dress.*

Class 26 – Concours Ridden. *This is not fancy dress.*

Class 27 – Novice Rider. Open to any breed. Horse or Pony to be 4 years old and over. Walk and Trot only in the go around. Canter in the individual show is optional, will not be penalised if no canter is shown. Designed to help support the novice rider.

Class 28 – Novice Horse. Open to any breed. Horse or Pony to be 4 years old and over. Walk and Trot only in the go around. Canter in the individual show is optional, will not be penalised if no canter is shown. Designed to help support the novice horse.

Class 29 – Best Junior Rider. Rider to be 16 years old or under on the 1st January of the current showing year.

Class 30 – Best Senior Rider. Rider to be 17 years old or over on the 1st January of the current showing year.

Championship 1st and 2nd place from class 25- 30 to go forward to the championship. Champion and reserve to go forward to the supreme championship.

Class 34 - CHAPS (UK) Non-Native Open Ridden Qualifier. *Any height.*

Class 36- Open In Hand *Open in Hand: Any age, type, breed. Mares with foal at foot are not permitted. No exhibit under the age of one year may be exhibited on its own*

Class 37 -Open Ridden

Open Ridden: Any type or breed, four years of age and over. Can include Lead Rein and First Ridden (will not be included in the initial go-round). All riders must be the appropriate height / weight for their equine.

Championship 1st and 2nd place from class 36 to 37 to go forward to the championship. Champion and reserve to go forward to the supreme championship.

Ring four continued

Class 38 - Equitation Championships Open Qualifying Class. *Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Members' Handbook. Open to SSA Members and Non-Members. Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship Points. Southern Side Saddles sponsor a rosette to the highest placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. A rosette sponsored in memory of The Late Mr R Philpot is offered to the Adult Member and Just So Elegant Side Saddle Hire sponsor a rosette for the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out. Competitors must wear a hat to current Safety Standard or above.*

Class 39 – Side Saddle Riding Club Horse / Pony. The Judge shall be on the current SSA Judges' Panel Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over. Riders will be required to give a short show including a small jump, maximum 61cm (2'). The height may be adjusted during the course of the class at the Judge's discretion. The class shall be judged on the show, the manners of horse/pony and its suitability for the rider. Conformation will not be considered. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. Competitors must wear a hat to current Safety Standard or above.

Class 40 – Best Horse or Pony Ridden Side Saddle. The Judge shall be on the current SSA Judges' Panel Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over: conformation & manners will be taken into consideration; horses/ponies will not be stripped. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. The Highest placed coloured exhibit ridden by a competitor aged 16rs or over (who has not already qualified) receives a Special Rosette and qualifies for the Side Saddle Final at the CHAPS Championship Show. Open to any type of exhibit. Riders/Owners need not be a member or their exhibit registered with CHAPS at the time of qualification, but in order to compete at the Championships, the Rider/Owner must be a showing member and their horse/pony registered with CHAPS before entering the final. Lead Rein competitors are eligible for this class. Leaders must be correctly dressed. Competitors must wear a hat to current Safety Standard or above.

RESS

This Show is affiliated to The Rescue Equine Showing Society final taking place at the Equifest, Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 6th – 9th August 2025. The two highest exhibits not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify.

Definition of a Rescuee:

1. Any equine that is adopted, fostered, under a guardianship scheme from any National Equine Welfare Council registered Charity (NEWC).
2. Any equine that has been adopted, fostered, under a guardianship scheme from any other equine charity (must be registered with the Charity Commission).
3. Any equine that has been 'independently' rescued by an individual. There must be supporting evidence (photographic, veterinary) that will be included in the 'Rescue History' for the equine, to demonstrate their rescue status

TGCA

TGCA TOYS In Hand and Ridden Classes Affiliation Number TGCA/DC-LF-GK19

No known breeding required to enter these classes TGCA Breed classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association's (TGCA) National Breed Championship Show "TOYS". Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs. Part Bred classes, are open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the part bred finals at "TOYS". The exhibit must have one parent that is pure bred traditional gypsy cob. Stallions – All stallions (pure or part bred, four years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class MUST be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA stallion evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two, MUST be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook. Current TGCA members must present their Membership card and Qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature. Non-members MUST receive a qualification card from the judge and have 21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification.

Please refer to www.tgca.co.uk for further details including membership, horse registration and showing rules (contained within the members handbook). Championships Quest for a Star Championship - TGC - 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship as per below rule. ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship. Membership card and Members qualification card (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS. Go for Glory Championship - PB -1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA part bred classes may go forward to the Go for Glory Championship. For 2024 TOYS q ualifiers, the handler/rider and exhibits (apart from stallions) do not have to be TGCA members/registered on the date of the show. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Crowning Glory Championships at TOYS.

CHAPS (UK)

This show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse and Pony Society (UK) Affiliation no. 25-077

Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need NOT be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However, in order to qualify for both the owner and rider/exhibitor need to be a current showing member and have a valid qualifier card. Members to apply in to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card.

First round qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final:

VETERAN HORSE OF THE YEAR 2025

Kindly Sponsored by Allen & Page. Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

VHS Regional Final qualification. *All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each age category will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their cards in the ring and have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership. This MUST be done within 21 days of qualification. It is the competitors' responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.*

Those wishing to join or renew with the Society will need to apply for this before 1st May each year or a late penalty fee of £15 will be charged.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, to be held at Arena UK, Lincolnshire on 29th – 31st August 2025. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule which is available mid-season 2025.
